5	Arwodhow yn stretow / Street signs Beach Hill, Dowlerry = Mena an Treth Berries Avenue, Bude = Rosva Las Berres There is evidence of Berries appearing on the Stratton TA as "Berrys". Interpreting the meaning as <berr> 'short' + <res> 'ford'. Berries Avenue Field = Park Rosva Las Berres Bickland Water Farm Lane = Bownder Tir Budhek Wartha The Swanpool Stream passes through the Bickland Water, possibly influencing the name. But it is likely a corruption of	

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	Cornish <wartha> 'higher'.	
	The name "Bickland" may come from:	
	1. The 'bishopric's lands'. Some plots of the Bickland tenement were owned by the Bishop of Exeter and others by the local church on the Budock tithe apportionment (1843).	
	2. 'Budock lands'	
	The name "Bickland" dates back to at least 1769, found in survey map of the area: "Eglos Budock, Bicklands & Hill Crofts." (Source: Kresen Kernow, AD332/1/13). There was an earlier "Beckling" spelling in 1748 but this gives no further insight to the meaning. It seems likely the name was associated with the local church first.	
	ACTION: Add note for Address Management that "farm" could be omitted from the EN name.	SR
	Grove Parc, Tywardreath Highway = Park Kelli	
	Lane Corner & Wesleyan Reach, Blackwater = DEFERRED	
	ACTION: Check with developer regarding their interest in continuing with 'Wesleyan' and its location.	SR
	Oakwood, St Columb = Derves	
	Old Station Road, Goonbell, St Agnes = Fordh Henworta	
	This site is the former Goonbell Halt, therefore using the term <i>gorta</i> 'halt'.	
	Plymouth Road, Liskeard = Fordh Aberplymm	
	Saltbox Road, Mylor Bridge = Fordh Holangist	
	The meaning of "saltbox" is unknown. Possibly in reference to oyster keeps to the northeast.	
	The Causeway, Hayle = An Kons	
	Tremeddan Court, Liskeard = Garth Treveden	
	Previously interpreted as Treveden. The name appears to be of modern construction with an unknown meaning. Possibly

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containing 'eden' or linked to Tremedda in Zennor, which contains <meder> 'reaper'.

Tincombe Park = **Park Tingcombe**

Containing a family name.

Sungirt Valley, Liskeard = **Nans Howlyek**

Thankes Park, Torpoint = **Park Tonk**

This name has links to the placename Thanckes (Anthony) spelled Thonkys in 1349 and family name Thonke 1321. Suggest spelling it as 'Tonk'.

Ellis Valley, Hayle = **Nans Ellis**

Containing a family name.

Barrowfields, Newquay = **Meskrugow**

Burnewhall SW 406 235 = **Bosdenewel**

Adopting the historic spelling Bosdenewel 1328. This may contain <tenewel> an adjectival version of <tenewen> 'side'.

Burtiven = OMITTED

Carn Barges = **Karn Bargos**

Containing <bargos> 'buzzard'.

Carn Mellin (SW450237) = **Karn Melyn**

Carn Silver (SW440232) = **Karn Arghans**

Choone = **Chiwoon**

Chough Zawn = **Sawen Palores**

Chyangwens = **Chi an Gwyns**

Chycandra = **Chikenderow**

Spelled Chycandroe in 1591, thought to contain <kenderow>

	Chynance = Chinans	
	Chyvarton = Chi war Tonn	
	Crean = DEFERRED	
	Spelled Kacregan in 1238. Suggestions included <kar> 'fort' + unknown element; <ke> 'hedge' + unknown element; <karregan> '(place of the / little) rock'; <krugan> '(place of the / little) barrow'; <krogen> 'shell'.	
	The absence of an <r> in the historical form makes 'fort' less likely. Although there is evidence of rounds in the area, this is not at Crean itself.	
	Dorminack = Dormeynek	
	Downs Barn = OMITTED	
	Gazell = An Gasel	
	A coastal feature. Containing <kasel> 'armpit'. It is the name of the cove rather than the rock.	
	Gilly (SW384250) = An Gelli	
	Containing <kelli> 'grove'.	
	Lamorna Cove = Porth Nansmornow	
	Grambla (SW438257) = An Krommlegh	
	"The Grambla" is a property name on modern mapping.	
	Le Scathe (SW406228) = Legh Skath	
	Lower Leha (aka Leha) = DEFERRED	
	Possible meanings include <lyha> 'lesser'; <leghen> 'slab'; and <leghow> 'slabs'.
